Sports Premium Grant September 2016-July 2017

At St John the Baptist, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

The Sports Premium Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

St John the Baptist School receives £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year. (£8,345)

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Summary of spending and impact:	
1. Improve the teaching of Physical Education and the learning experience for all pupils.	All pupils received at least one hour PE teaching with qualified Sports coaches. All elements of P.E. Curriculum (except swimming) were covered for each year group. Specialist coaches work alongside school own staff to aid staff development. All groups participated effectively. Children enjoy lessons.
2. Enhance the playtime experience by making playtimes and lunchtimes more active.	Large Trim Trail equipment was made safer by refreshing the bark area. All pupils have access to the Trim Trail and it is used constantly.



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3. To introduce Orienteering into curriculum focused on school site and local area.	Whole school introduced to orienteering. School environment was mapped and school staff trained to deliver lessons. All children participated and achieved objectives.
4. To improve the quality of Physical Development play for EYFS pupils.	Outdoor classroom area had been refreshed with new bark chippings for safer play. New ride-on toys purchased to develop gross motor skills and eye hand coordination.
5. To motive and celebrate achievement of all pupils in P.E.	All pupils participated and enjoyed a full day of sports during Summer 2016. Children achieved individual targets and worked as part of a team. New Sports day trophies and stickers celebrated achievements in sporting activities.
6. Support School Sport in Colne Valley Consortium and North West Essex School Games	Wide range of competitions and festivals has been attended by groups across the school. These included Indoor Athletics, Cross Country and District Sports.
<p>Overall Impact</p> <p>All children engage in high quality PE for at least 2 hours weekly including swimming. A growing percentage of children attend sports based clubs and activities including Football, Multiskills and Street Dance. Children recognise the benefits to health, wellbeing and social interaction that sport provides Teaching is enhanced by CPD. St John the Baptist School competes with other local schools and beyond if possible in a wide range of sports. A programme of CPD is available leading to delivery of high quality PE lessons.</p>
